Albuquerque Hispano Chamber of Commerce	842-9003.....	Provides for small business and economic development through international trade groups and conventions and tourism forums
All Faith Receiving Home	271-0329.....	Provides short and long term shelter for non-delinquent children up to age 12, whose parents are unable to care for them because of emergency or crisis in the family, including abuse or neglect
Barrett House (Woman and Children)	243-4887.....	Night shelter and emergency help only, up to three weeks
Casa Milagro	883-8870.....	Provides transitional housing for homeless women over the age of 40 who suffer from chronic mental illness
Catholic Charities	247-9521.....	Provides housing for single mothers, Immigration Info and offers computer class training and English as a second language.
Central NM Community College	224-4684.....	College prep classes, adult education, English as a second language, GED preparation and testing Associate degrees and certificates in business, health, technologies and trade occupations

Community Dental Services	843-7493.....	Provides fillings, extractions, cleaning, x-ray, fluoride treatment, root canal therapy, simple orthodontia and dental health education. Services primarily for low-income families living in the State of New Mexico
Echo Inc. Commodities	242-6777.....	Provides food for seniors and children under 6 years, not on W.I.C. must be low income.
First Choice Community Health Care	873-7400.....	Provides medical health services to persons in need of preventive or healthy maintenance care. Both preventative and emergency dental care also available
Good Shepherd Manor	898-0177.....	Shelter for men only, 7 nights up to 7-months
Goodwill of New Mexico	881-6401.....	Employment training, help in looking for work. Skill training, develop skills and job oriented.
H.E.L.P New Mexico	265-3717.....	Helps with rent, utility bills, employment, child care and counseling
Greater Albq. Habitat for Humanity	265-0057.....	Uses donations of volunteer labor, materials and money to build simple, decent, affordable housing for Albuquerque's low income families
Independent Living Resource Center	266-5022	Provides such services as advocacy, information and independent living skills training for people with disabilities. Provides home modifications, vehicle adaptations, deaf equipment and various types of assistive technology. Deaf Independent Living Program and American Sign Language classes are offered.

Methodist Children's Home	255-8740.....	Provides counseling, case management, parent training resource referrals and live skills training for at-risk families
Money Management International	884-6601.....	Professional counseling to people needing guidance in money management, budgeting and the wise use of credit. Where over-extension of indebtedness is a major problem the agency will attempt to work out a repayment program. Provides education programs on credit buying, budgeting, checkbook management, understanding credit and other related topics.

New Mexico Mortgage Finance Authority	843-6880.....	Provides a variety of housing finance programs for low-income New Mexicans

S.A.F.E. House	247-4219.....	Shelter for women and children who are victims of domestic violence
Senior Affairs (Dept. of)	764-6400.....	Different programs, referrals for housing, modifying steps for walkers and building wheelchair ramps

St. Martins	843-9405.....	Rental assistance, deposits, utilities provides clients also with showers and mailroom long term storage
St. Vincent De Paul Society	346-1500.....	Provides emergency financial assistance for food, rent, utilities and other reasonable requests. Operates two thrift stores which have a variety of used clothing, household goods and furniture.
Salvation Army (The)	881-4293.....	Emergency rental assistance for persons with eviction notices, emergency utility assistance for persons with shut off notices. Grocery orders for families who are in need, casework services to local transient persons; assistance in locating missing persons. Food to needy families throughout the year, including holidays.
SER de New Mexico	268-4500.....	Homeownership pre and post counseling, homeownership default counseling and GED programs.
United Way of Central NM	247-3671.....	Identifies local health & human care issues through collaborative methods. This information is used to make community allocation decisions.
UNM Women's Resource Center	277-3716	Help women in domestic violence or crisis situations, develop self-sufficiency through educational and support services and counseling. Support services for children who witness domestic violence. Other programs include self-defense, job skills training, support groups, computer skills, financial planning, stress management and domestic violence education classes
